Chinamans Hollow and Maybury Peace Park are beautiful green spaces, but what prompted the name 'Peace Park' and who was the market gardener who gave the Hollow its name? This exhibition brings the Hollow's hidden stories to light.

Today international artists regularly play in the vineyards.
