

Since joining Council in 2022, my focus has been on refining our approach to ensure we are more tactical, adaptive and dynamic in delivering positive outcomes for our residents.

In response to community feedback, we've increasingly prioritised the enhancement of local infrastructure and improving roads, footpaths, and bridges. This shift over time has yielded impressive results, marked by our consistent year-on-year growth in the delivery of infrastructure projects. I'm proud of Council's efforts as we continue to ramp up progress across both maintenance and capital works.

Over the past year, we celebrated the completion of numerous exciting projects. Notable achievements include upgrades to Watagan Creek Bridges 1 and 3, the rehabilitation of Sandy Creek Road, the reopening of Orange Street in Abermain following extensive upgrades, as well as further progress on the South Cessnock flood mitigation works and the visionary Branxton to Greta Cycleway project.

Following the flood disasters of February and June 2022, Council has also undertaken substantial repairs to landslip-affected sites, including Stockyard Creek Road, Finchley Track and Boree Valley Road, Great North Road, and Paynes Crossing Road. Our on-going efforts continue as we focus on restoring local roads and ensuring the safety of our community.

In accordance with our adopted Operational Plan, we continue to fulfil our commitments. We place a high priority on the timely and cost-effective completion of projects underway, while preparing for future vital and exciting initiatives on the horizon. These initiatives include a CBD upgrade to Branxton Town Centre, flood mitigation diversion works at Heddon Greta, a netball facility upgrade at Booth Park in Kurri Kurri, and upgrades in Wollombi Village.

With a clear focus on excellence, we're confident our collective efforts will ensure our success and lead to positive, long-lasting outcomes for our community.


# An Update on Strategic Planning in the Cessnock LGA



### **Review of Key Strategies**

Council has commenced review of a number of key land use planning studies including the Employment Lands Study and Rural Land Study. These studies were last completed in 2017 and there has been considerable changes in the market, Local Government Area and key trends since this time. Council is in the initial stages of these projects, and community consultation will be carried out as these projects progress.

# Cessnock Commercial Precinct and Branxton Town Centre Public Domain Plans



The Cessnock Commercial Precinct Plan was adopted in 2017 and the Branxton Town Centre Public Domain Plan was adopted in 2019. Valuable community input informed the development of these two documents. Council has commenced a review of existing plans and

guidelines applying to the Cessnock Commercial Precinct and Branxton Town Centre. Given the significant community input in the original plans, the review is considered to be an update of the existing documents. The project involves establishing the status of adopted actions, investigating the suitability and viability of pending actions, and where required identify alternate options for achieving the underlying desired outcomes for the plans. The project will consider potential opportunities and challenges on identified issues, such as flood risk, traffic and parking, active transport and pedestrian amenity. Council will engage with both internal and external stakeholders and other interested parties to inform the preparation of a revised masterplan area.

## **Wollombi Road Upgrade Project**



We're upgrading Wollombi Road to make it safer, improve traffic flow, and better handle more vehicles – ensuring it meets both current and future needs.


- The updated design for Stage 1 reflects feedback from our conversations with the community over the past year. You can view the design online (scan the QR code) or in person at Cessnock City Library.





